

Lesson 2 - 1 Timothy Chap. 2

The healthy church, the Church of the living God, the pillar and foundation of truth, must be concerned with the salvation of men.

1. Is it hard to pray for wrong government? Or for a president you no longer sympathize with? What does Paul urge us to do in this regard?

2. Why are our prayers for all people good and welcome before God? Who needs your prayers: God, you, people?

Prayer creates the recognition of the need for God, a recognition of dependence on God. Therefore, it remains a permanent discipline for the believer's health.

3. What is God's will for salvation and what is the role of Jesus and Paul in this process?

4. In verse 8 we are shown the place of man in the fulfillment of the plan of salvation. What are the 3 things that men are asked to do and what do you think each one means?

5. How are your hands? What percentage of your work(job) is honest? What does your neighbor say about how easily you get angry? How are you with doubt? Do you still trust God even if it's hard for you?

Discuss and make decisions to change where needed.

Ask the group for help in fulfilling these decisions.
Don't forget: health means noticing stains, but also cleaning them!

6. Verses 9-15 show us the role of women in carrying out the plan of salvation. In verses 9-10 we notice a contrast. Which of the two terms of contrast is emphasized? Where do we usually focus?

How are you doing with decency? How do you stand out from those around you?

7. Verses 13-15 show us the place of women in the fulfillment of the plan of salvation. What is the hierarchy left by God in chapter 2?
What are the arguments for the place of women in this hierarchy?
